

Three Divisions with awards for first place, second place and third place. Prize or trophy for first place with ribbons for second and third in each division.

- Traditional Shortbread
- Non-traditional Shortbread
- Specialized/Health

Rules:

- No commercially made entries allowed (Sorry, can't use Walkers!) All entries must be homemade.
- Individual entries on separate plates
- Only one entry per person in each division. Yes, you may enter one in each division.
 No pre-sign up needed.

Bring your shortbread entries to the Gazebo at the festival to enter it for judging on Saturday at 1 p.m. Sign in at the registration table with your name, clan, type of shortbread and contact info. It will be assigned a number and placed on the judging tables. You may use any kind of plate, serving dish, etc.

Judging is tentatively scheduled for 2 p.m. in the gazebo. Winners will be announced immediately after the judging is complete. Please plan to pick up your awards and join in the photo op for winners. You are invited to take your shortbread entries back to your clan tents to share. Please pick up your shortbread from the gazebo immediately following the announcement of winners, or it will be eaten by guests!
